Today, while her main focus is teaching, she continues to perform as a soloist, orchestra and ensemble member and a concertmaster of the White Rock City Orchestra.

Monika has been teaching for over 20 years, and is experienced in teaching all levels of violin. She is a Gold Medal Teacher with the Royal Conservatory of Music, and her students have won prizes, trophies, first places and were the class winners in many local and international festivals. They also performed at the Carnegie Hall, attended multiple master classes with accomplished violinists, performed as soloists with the orchestra and had been admitted to orchestras and universities.
